WEEKLY ONLINE CURRENCY TRADING TRAINING FOR KIDS AND YOUNG YOUTHS.

The advent of internet has changed the narrative in our daily lives. People now sit in the comfort of their homes to order goods and this has led to high street stores closing and online shops like Ebay and Amazon thriving. Our young ones must be equipped to build confidence and be able to follow the trend as they evolve. This project is aimed at impacting knowledge on the young by leveraging on the opportunities information technology avail us to make an income and be independent to the employment market. Kids introduced to marketing and trading at early stage find it simple and very convenient to stay on course. This creates the desired interest in finance, numbers and arithmetic's which also serve them well in school. It becomes part of their lives and something they look forward to. Forex is the acronym of foreign exchange. Retrospectively forex was done on the trading floors, but the advent of internet has changed the format. Trading mechanism is now connected electronically across the globe. Forex trading does not sleep, there is opportunity to trade anytime of the day.

We intend to create awareness by starting the kids off early by getting them interested in a fun way that allow them experiment under monitoring, on how the forex work and how to make money from it. They will learn how forex work, how to trade and how to read the chart which is the visual representation of the currency movement. The business aspect of forex trading is to know what currency is strong and which is weak and to bid your timing in knowing when to buy/sell and what to buy/sell to make profit at the end. The kids will be able to tell when any currency is strong or when it is weak. They will be able to speculate the market trend thereby making money from the knowledge they have.

This training will be delivered by professional trader with over 8 years trading experience and who is keen to get children started at an early stage to get them become financially independent and more confident adult as they grow.

We intend to use the community spaces available and hoping to finalise agreement with the Carlton Heritage Learning Centre to be able to go into partnership with them and to use their facility.

This program will run weekly for 2 hours for one year.

This project evolved from private dealings with few selected kids within Calton Ward 9. It is hoped that from this training, the kids will become self-reliant and be able to go into self-employment.
